Instructions - Eddie's Garden

Lesson 1

Time

Learn how to find one quarter and recognise a half and a quarter by looking at equal pieces. Recognise the similarities and differences of images that show one quarter. Click [here](#).

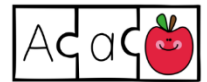

Challenge 1: To investigate the colours
