Residential Trip to Marrick Priory 2024

I am delighted to inform you that we have provisionally secured another residential booking at the much sort after Marrick Priory Outdoor Education and Residential centre for our Year 5 children in March 2024 – our current Year 4.

Marrick Priory is a historic 12th century medieval building that was developed in the 1970s into an Outdoor Education and Residential Centre. It is situated in Swaledale in the heart of the beautiful Yorkshire Dales National Park and welcomes groups of visitors from all over the world. Marrick Priory provides a wide range of adventurous activities which include rock climbing, canoeing, kayaking, caving, orienteering, hill walking, mountaineering, archery, zip wires, low and high ropes courses and team building exercises. I have included photographs of this year's trip to show how much fun the children have!

The residential will take place week beginning **Monday 11th March 2024 to Friday 15th March 2024** and the cost of the visit will be around £380.00 per child. Unfortunately for 2024 there is a price increase from the companies due to inflation.

If you would like to register your interest and secure a place, a **non-refundable deposit of £35 is due by Monday 24**th **April 2023.** The rest of the balance, once the booking has been made, will be able to be paid in instalments throughout the year. Once deposits have been paid, we can book the trip with Marrick, unfortunately if there is not enough interest the residential will not be able to go ahead.

Please encourage your child to attend the residential visit as this is a once in a lifetime opportunity for our children to experience and participate in a variety of different activities, this will stand them in good stead as they progress into Year 6 and beyond.

If you are in receipt of the following benefits: Universal credit, Income Support, Income Based Job Seekers Allowance, support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, Child Tax credit: provided that Working Tax Credit is also not received and the family's income does not exceed £16,190 and you need support with payment for this trip please contact the school office for further details.
