Why is punctuality important?

How do we recognise and reward good attendance?

We use a variety of positive strategies to reward good attendance and encourage pupils to attend to school regularly. These can include certificates, badges, or prizes for weekly, termly, or yearly excellent attendance.

Attendance is celebrated in our assemblies, and we give out special mentions, or display names on attendance boards. How do we hold parents / carers accountable for attendance?

We hold families accountable for attendance by setting clear expectations and regularly monitoring pupil attendance. When concerns arise, we will contact parents or carers to discuss reasons for absence and offer support. If attendance does not improve, we may arrange meetings, issue formal warning letters, or create attendance improvement plans.

Persistent unauthorised absences can lead to involvement from the local authority, including penalty notices or legal action. We work in partnership with families but stress that ensuring regular attendance is a legal responsibility. By addressing issues early and consistently, schools aim to improve attendance while maintaining accountability and promoting student success.
